President's Message

And just like that summer has arrived! This first half of 2022 has certainly flown by!

We held our first "hybrid" State Board meeting at the end of April. While a few officers were actually able to gather in person in Syracuse due to their work demands, others joined virtually for either all or parts of the



meeting. It was good to meet and/or see people after the last couple of stress-filled years where we were limited to virtual connection. Prior to COVID our spring board meeting took place over two days, providing an opportunity for board members to socialize in the evening. This spring we managed to compress the meeting and cover a great deal in a single day. We understand the need, especially for new officers, to connect with others, but also recognize the overwhelming work load amid all the staffing shortages.

From my role as the Standing Rules and Bylaws chair, we voted on changes in the Standing Rules to implement the process for Zones to request funds for educational activities. Please reach out to information@nysiddddna.org for access to the "Zone Expenditure Report – Reimbursement Request" form if your Zone is looking for funds for local educational activities. Guidelines are in place for what the Association's funds can be used for. A committee was formed to review the new process to ensure Association funds are equitably distributed to our membership.

Since we have eliminated the Zone Treasurer position, if you are currently serving as a Zone Treasurer, PLEASE consider volunteering as a Zone Co-chair to help schedule / host local educational activities throughout the year, or as a Zone Representative to the State Board, or as the Zone

Secretary to keep meeting minutes. Educational activities at the Zone level provide connection and mentorship to nurses who are new to this practice area. Newsletter reports from the Zones provide ideas for other Zones around presentation topics and connections with speakers. These functions are vital to the Association.

Zone Officers: Please mark your calendars for our virtual fall State Board meeting on December 2, 2022 from 8:30 AM to 12:30 PM.

Be on the lookout for those confirmed revisions to the Standing Rules as well as recommendations for Bylaws revisions in your email. Please review the proposed changes to the Bylaws before the Annual Conference in preparation for full membership vote at our Annual Meeting during the conference.

NYS was well represented with nurses attending the DDNA national conference in San Antonio. The enthusiasm for gathering in person after two years was palpable even though DDNA anticipated fewer attendance numbers and ended up having to close their conference registration early. Let's hope these are positive signs for our conference attendance this October. We will offer a reduced fee early bird conference registration. CEUs will be offered. Many thanks to Edie Smith for offering her time and expertise for the CEU application process.

If you will be a "first time" attendee for our conference, let us know. We will do our best to connect you with other attendees, especially those members within your Zone. Those of us who attended the DDNA conference also made many contacts with vendors/exhibitors who have committed to coming to our fall conference with information about new products.

We hope to host webinars throughout the year, so continue to watch for additional Zoom offerings.

DDNA Update

DDNA celebrates its 30-year anniversary and remembers the group of nurses who supported individuals with developmental disabilities and met in Buffalo, NY to discuss the idea of a national organization.

The commitment for "advocacy, education and support for nurses who provided services to persons with developmental disabilities," as well as the development of a goal to "foster the growth of nursing knowledge and expertise about optimal care of persons with DD, thereby improving their care, services and quality of life," were a result of those important discussions and continue today.

DDNA now has over 1000 members with many participating in activities to further the mission to "educate, empower, and advocate for nurses practicing in the specialty of developmental disabilities nursing."

Members of the DDNA Research Council developed a survey related to the COVID-19 experiences of DDNA members with the results published in three peer-reviewed journals.

The members of the DDNA Practice Council developed a DD nursing professional practice model and a 3rd edition of the Practice Standards of Developmental Disability Nursing. The Practice Council will soon release a revised position paper on medication management along with a new companion document with best practice guidelines.

DDNA has also launched the monthly "DD Nursing E-News" newsletter and a new monthly "Webinar Wednesday" event to create more learning opportunities for members.

NYSIDDDNA 2022 Annual Conference | October 17-18 at the Albany Marriott

The Conference Planning Committee has made excellent progress planning our return to an in-person conference. The Annual Conference will be held October 17-18, 2022 at the Albany Marriott.

The conference this year is slightly shorter than in previous years. We decided to host a two day conference for two reasons. We wanted to reduce the amount of time attendees will need to be away from their work place, and we wanted to keep the cost affordable for our attendees. We believe we have accomplished both goals.

We will be updating the website by mid June with information about the Annual Conference. This information will include the master schedule, the list of programs, registration fees, the registration form, and the hotel reservation details.

The Conference-At-A-Glance:

Our first program, the Keynote Presentation will begin at 9:15 a.m. on Monday, October 17. We have a full day scheduled with the keynote, three sets of concurrent sessions, our Opening Lunch, and time to visit with the exhibitors in the morning and afternoon. Dinner will be on your own on Monday evening. For those of you arriving at the hotel before 9:15 on Monday morning, we will have coffee, tea, and some light refreshments.

Tuesday will begin early with breakfast served at 7:30. Our Annual Meeting will begin at 8:15. The Annual Meeting is for all attendees. We will have two sets of concurrent sessions, with time to visit the exhibitors during a morning break. The last session will be our Capstone presentation and will feature updates given by Susan Prendergast, Director of Nursing and Health Services, NYS OPWDD. The conference will end at 2:45 after the conclusion of the Capstone presentation.

Reserving Your Hotel Room:

You can reserve your hotel room at any time. The conference rate of \$129 (plus 14% tax) for a single or double is available through **Thursday, September 29.** Conference room rates are available on the nights of October 16 and 17.

The NYS ID/DD Nurses Association has 12 zones, as you will see on this zone map.


To find your zone, look for your county on this map of New York State. *Note:* Zones 9 and 11 are combined into one zone. Members from outside NYS are members of Zone 12.
