Renewing Your NYSIDDDNA Membership

The new membership year begins on April 1st. We are currently updating the membership application process. When the new process is ready, all current members will receive an email message with a link to the site. Please wait to renew your membership until you receive notification that the membership link is ready. If you have already renewed your membership for 2023, your information will be transferred to our new membership spreadsheet.

The annual membership fee is \$50. The associate membership fee (\$30) is available for full time nursing students and inactive nurses (unemployed or retired). Membership dues can be paid by check (personal or agency) or through PayPal. The 2023 membership year is from April 1, 2023 until March 31, 2024.

If you will be paying by PayPal: The new process will ask you to complete the membership application first. If you prefer to pay by check, that option will be available to you.

New CDC Recommendations

CDC Adds New Recommendations for Adult/Child Immunizations

The CDC has adjusted recommendations for adult and child immunizations and has come out with a flow chart giving ages, indications, and contraindications. There are color coded charts available from CDC.gov.

Highlights of changes include:


- **Covid Vaccine:** Recommendations include a 2-dose primary series plus one booster for adults and 2-dose primary vaccine for children starting at 6 months. COVID vaccination was not made a requirement for school attendance.
- **Hepatitis B:** There is a new Hepatitis B vaccine PreHevBrio for adults (not recommended in pregnancy due to lack of safety data).
- **Polio:** There is no standard recommendation for revaccination of adults unless there are exposure risk factors.
- **Pneumonia:** The information explains when an adult or child would need another pneumococcal vaccine beyond what they had already received. Risk factors are defined.
- **MMR:** There is new approved vaccine available, Priorix.
